Archway Theatre Youth Workshop

This will be the seventh youth workshop production. Since its beginnings the workshop has grown from about 10 members to nearly 80 spread across 4 sessions from age 6 to 16 years old. During this last year we introduced a further Saturday session for the 9-12 year age group, but still we have a waiting list of around 30. We have for the time being had to close the waiting list, as we do not anticipate being able to accommodate all of this list.

Looking back over the year workshop members have taken part in 'The Witches' and 'Measure for Measure'. We have also attended a day seminar for youth theatres, also many of the youngsters have attended Archway Theatre workshops lead by professional actors. This year after an absence of some years the Archway Theatre took part in the Horley Carnival procession, which was supported predominantly by Workshop members.

We would like to record our thanks to all of the helpers and people who have given us support over the last year, especially to the older workshop members who have assisted each week with the Junior Workshop after school on Wednesdays. A special thank you goes to the adult leaders and company members who give up their time to assist and take the occasional session.

For the next year, we are looking forward to some exciting events. David Wood a well know childrens playwright has agreed to come and lead a workshop session. The Globe Theatre education trust has offered to come and work with the youngsters, with the aim of them acting on the Globe Stage during an afternoon in London. The Archway Theatre programme for 2000 will include at least three plays where members of the workshop will have the opportunity to participate. 'Cinderella' in January, 'Kaleidoscope II' in June, and 'Oliver' in late August.

A very big thank you must go to the set builders, scene painters, and costumiers for this production, who have once again pulled out the stops to get everything ready in absolute minimal time. Finally without the continued support of the Archway Theatre Council of Managment, and the parents of our members we simply would not be able to continue our work with the Youth Workshop.
